Columbus County Sheriff's Office \$10 million

EMS/911 Center \$5 million (\$2 million of those funds were used to buy the downtown campus.

The 911 center will be housed in the flat building facing Lee St.)

Columbus County Historic Courthouse \$4 million

Columbus County Municipal Airport \$7 million (new Terminal Building)

Columbus County Garage \$250,000

Pedestrian Trail Funds \$2.5 million
